- 2. The program name has changed to York County Mosquito Surveillance Program
- 3. There is a pending address change, that we expect to be effective by the start of the 2020 season and I will update you when the final determination has been made.
- 4. Residents with complaints or concerns, should visit the PA DEP (Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection) West Nile Virus Control Program website <u>http://www.depgis.state.pa.us/WNV/index.html</u> Here, they will be able to submit a concern directly to DEP, which will be assigned to the appropriate county for investigation. As always, municipalities should contact us directly, regarding abandoned properties, swimming pools, illegal dumping, or any areas of concern within the municipality.

Due to record levels of virus samples and control measures, throughout the county in 2018, there has been a significant drop in the mosquito population for 2019. We expect the population to rebound, however at this point in the season, surveillance numbers remain low.
