

## *LWT Awarded Multi-Modal Grant for Crosswalk Project*


After the third attempt to procure funding for a crosswalk project on Cool Creek Road, the Township is able to announce success! A new avenue was attempted last August, and a grant application was submitted for the Multi-Modal Transportation Fund Grant through the Department of Community & Economic Development. The project aims to improve pedestrian safety and connectivity by constructing a mid-block crossing on Cool Creek Road (S.R. 2011) adjacent to Eastern York High School & Middle School. A new residential development, River Ridge Hills, is being built directly across the street from the school, and there is currently no designated or protected pedestrian crossing in the area. As a result, students and families will be forced to cross a high-volume roadway at an uncontrolled location. The Township Engineer, John Affriol, contributed a creative design concept that includes:

- A new sidewalk to connect to the existing school sidewalk
- A high-visibility, “piano keys” crosswalk
- ADA-compliant curb ramps on both sides of the road
- Pedestrian-activated rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFBs)
- Advance signage with RRFBs and pavement markings

RRFBs enhance pedestrian safety at crosswalks by providing a high-intensity flashing light that alerts drivers to the presence of pedestrians. These beacons have been shown to improve driver-yielding rates and reduce pedestrian crashes. They are an effective tool for improving pedestrian safety, particularly in mid-block or uncontrolled crossing locations. Cool Creek Road serves as a key collector road with an average daily traffic volume of nearly 5,000 vehicles and a posted speed limit of 35 mph. However, drivers frequently travel at excessive speeds. The combination of high vehicle speeds, lack of traffic calming, and the absence of a safe crossing creates a dangerous environment, particularly for children walking or biking to school.

Letters of support for the project were received from Lower Windsor Township Planning Commission, Eastern York School District, Horst & Son Home Builders, York County Planning Commission, and State Senator Kristin Phillips-Hill.

By supporting walkability and reducing safety hazards, the project encourages families to remain or relocate within the school district, supporting continued residential investment and community growth. Additionally, the project demonstrates a strong partnership between the Township and the School District, reinforcing a shared commitment to safe, accessible public infrastructure that benefits the entire community. Enhanced pedestrian infrastructure also contributes to long-term public health and quality of life by promoting active transportation options for students and residents.

### 2026 BUDGET

On December 11, 2025, the Lower Windsor Township Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the Township's 2026 Budget. The Board and staff remain committed to controlling expenses each year in order to limit the need for tax increases. However, to maintain the current level of services provided to residents, the Board authorized an increase in the real estate tax rate to 2.5 mils for 2026. Therefore, a property assessed at \$100,000 will incur a real estate tax of \$250 for the year.

## Zoning Department

### Permits:

Lower Windsor Township requires permits for many types of construction and building work. Some jobs require only a ‘Zoning Permit’ and other jobs will require a ‘Building Permit’. These are separate permits which now use the same application form. Zoning permits fall under Township rules and ordinances. Building Permits are governed by the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code and will require inspections during the work. Zoning Permits are issued within 10 business days and Building Permits require 15 business days.

There is only one permit application to fill out. The permit issued will be Zoning, Building or both. Each permit has different fee requirements, but both are issued from the Township office. For questions about permits, call the Township Zoning Officer, Monica Love, at 717-244-6813.

### Hiring a Contractor

Once you hire a contractor, and BEFORE work is scheduled to begin, the homeowner or the contractor MUST apply for a permit. Building permits can take up to fifteen business days, because they are reviewed by a third party, Commonwealth Code Inspection Services, Inc.

If the contractor applies for the permit, the homeowner should ask the contractor for the permit, so that it may be posted in the window of the residence. If the contractor does not get a permit, the homeowner is still legally responsible to obtain one.

## Septic Pumping

Please be aware, when having your septic system pumped and inspected, you are required to hire a pumper/hauler that is registered with the Township. They have agreed to abide by our regulations. **Using an unlicensed pumper/hauler can cause your manifest to be returned as unacceptable.**

Find the current list of registered pumper/haulers on the Township website, or call the office at 717-244-6813 and one can be emailed to you.

### IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

In January of 2026 residents in District 1 were notified this is the year to have their septic tank pumped and inspected in accordance with Ordinance 2001-01. District 1 are all properties east of Cabin Creek Road & Cool Creek Road and north of East Prospect Road and Calvary Church Road. If you received a notice and have not yet had your system pumped/inspected, please do so by the end of 2026. If you did not receive a notice, but think you should have, please contact the Township to verify your address. This is a PA State Mandate, and **non-compliance will result in penalties.** If you have a holding tank, you **must** have it pumped every year. Don't wait – pumper/haulers get very busy at the end of the year!

In 2027, residents in District 2 will get notifications to have their septic tank pumped and inspected. District 2 is all properties south of East Prospect Road & Calvary Church Road and east of Prayer Mission Road & Snyder Corner Road. You can also get your system pumped in 2026 and you'll still be compliant for 2027. Look for your letter next January.

If your taxes are escrowed, it is your responsibility to contact your mortgage company to see if they need a copy of your bill. All original tax bills are sent to the homeowner.

If you need a receipt, include the entire copy of your bill (taxpayer copy and tax collector copy) with a self-addressed, stamped envelope. I will stamp and sign the taxpayer copy and return it to you for you to use as a receipt. **If you do not include both copies of your bill with your self-addressed, stamped envelope, no receipt will be returned to you.** This needs to be done for both the county & township bill and the school bill.

**I do not accept any personal checks after December 9<sup>th</sup>.** Money orders and cashier's checks can still be mailed or put in the drop box beside the office door up until December 31<sup>st</sup>. I also accept credit card payments until December 31<sup>st</sup>. The website is [allpaid.com](http://allpaid.com). ***(please note: there is a non-refundable 2.95% fee that goes to the credit card company.)*** Cash can be brought to the office during office hours until December 31<sup>st</sup>. I do not recommend sending cash in the mail or putting it in the drop box.

**Please put your phone number on all payments. If there is a problem this is the quickest and easiest way for me to get in touch with you!!!**

Everyone in the township over the age of 18 and under the age of 65 are legally required to pay a school per capita tax (some exceptions apply). If you have anyone in your household that is not receiving one, please contact me at my office.
